our partners to create the winning conditions to ensure that the Quebec recycling industry is both less vulnerable and more resilient.



## FIVE OVERARCHING THEMES

## SIMPLIFY

Released in April 2018, the *Ça va où?* app is a simple, practical and easy-to-use tool that helps users make informed recycling choices. The app has been a hit since it was launched and is constantly being enhanced to make it more effective. A year later, the app has more than 84,000 downloads. It's a resounding, ongoing success!

## SUPPORT

Our financial assistance programs have a considerable driving effect on the entire recycling industry. For example: Sani-Éco, which received support after a call for proposals to improve the quality of markets for recyclable materials from curbside collection, as part of modernizing its facilities also implemented a sorting robot, SamourAI, at its Granby sorting centre. Using artificial intelligence, this robot can identify materials according to specific parameters as well as recognize new packaging on the market, thereby making it possible to maximize the amount of accepted recyclable materials and reduce discards by close to 1,000 tonnes.

## RAISE AWARENESS

The National Zero Waste Council and RECYC-QUÉBEC, as the main Francophone partner, have united to develop the Love Food Hate Waste [in French only] campaign. This campaign was rolled out across Canada and offers a wealth of information and practical advice to reduce food waste. Awareness-raising tools, inspired by the campaign developed in the UK. that have proven successful in terms of changing behaviours, were developed, including a turnkey toolkit for municipalities.

## **ACCOMPANY**

One of RECYC-QUÉBEC's main areas of intervention consists in supporting community actors and innovative projects that specifically promote reduction at source. To that end, RECYC-OUÉBEC is proud to support La Tasse as part of implementing the Comité mixte sur la réduction à la source's action plan. The first Quebec system for refundable coffee cups, La Tasse offers a reusable cup to replace disposable cups used for hot takeaway beverages. By supporting this type of initiative, RECYC-QUÉBEC wants to encourage the reusable cup offering in fast food restaurants and during events.

## **MOBILIZE**

RECYC-QUÉBEC held the very first Assises québécoises de l'économie circulaire conference, in partnership with the Ministry of Economy and Innovation (MEI) and the Institut de l'environnement, du développement durable et de l'économie circulaire (Institut EDDEC). It was a flagship event for Quebec's circular economy and it was both instructive and inspiring. It brought together and mobilized more than 400 participants from multisector organizations, companies, ministries and organizations around various circular economy-related themes.

## SUPPORT FOR THE RECYCLING INDUSTRY

RECYC-QUÉBEC has a catalytic effect by working closely with all stakeholders in the residual materials management value chain to implement concrete, efficient and sustainable solutions to improve the performance of curbside recycling in Quebec and develop high value-added markets.

Support for the recycling industry moreover was a focus in 2018–2019 and RECYC-QUÉBEC took several measures to support the stakeholders concerned and ensure the industry is stable and sustainable.



## Financial support

A total of \$13.5 million in financial support has been announced since early 2018 to help the recycling industry in Quebec, as part of various financial assistance programs and calls for proposals.

#### Support program for municipal curbside collection sorting centres [in French only]

- / **OBJECTIVE:** Offer financial support to sorting centres to ensure their operations are maintained and sustainable, combined with longer-term solutions to favour the development of local markets.
- / 21 sorting centres benefited from financial assistance for the first two collection dates in 2018–2019.

#### Call for proposals to improve the quality of and markets for recyclable materials in curbside collection [in French only]

- / **OBJECTIVE:** Solve problems related to recyclable materials markets and quality.
- / 11 projects were accepted, i.e., six sorting centres and five packagers.

## Call for proposals concerning markets for fibres from curbside collection [in French only]

- / **OBJECTIVE:** Support projects intended to solve market problems affecting fibres from curbside collection.
- / Approximately twenty requests were received and the projects selected will be announced in the fall of 2019.

## Committee on the modernization of the waste recovery and recycling industry

A committee on industry modernization was established in summer 2018 to review the basis of the current recyclable materials management system and recommend actions to the government that would foster higher-quality materials generated by sorting centres.

The committee met five times between July and September 2018. Committee members helped develop the support program for municipal curbside collection sorting centres and the call for proposals for markets to take curbside collected fibres.

#### Extended consultation on curbside collection

The extended consultation on curbside collection was held May 30, 2018 with the goal of formulating recommendations to propose a comprehensive modernization approach to Quebec curbside collection and the compensation plan. Transformative solutions aimed at reducing the risks of recurring crises were proposed by all stakeholders.

More than one hundred representatives directly involved in the Quebec waste recovery and recycling sector participated in this consultation.

## Sorting centres, packagers and recyclers working table

A working table bringing together Quebec sorting centres, packagers and recyclers was created and two meetings were held in 2018–2019. Its mandate was to discuss the sustainable and local use of recyclable materials produced in Quebec.

Two preliminary initiatives resulted from this table's efforts:

- / Working with the Centre de transfert technologique en écologie industrielle (CTTÉI), two networking workshops between sorting centres and fibre recyclers were held in October 2018 with the objective of creating synergies and agreements for mixed papers in Quebec.
- / Open houses were held in sorting centres during Ouebec Waste Reduction Week from October 20 to 28, 2018. A total of 10 sorting centres from different areas of Quebec opened their doors to allow citizens to better understand their operations and to raise awareness of the importance of proper sorting at home. More than 3,500 people took advantage of the opportunity to ask questions and see for themselves the work performed by sorting centres. RECYC-QUÉBEC coordinated communications as well as assisted participating sorting centres in their activities.

## MUNICIPAL SECTOR

#### Collaboration with remote communities

RECYC-OUÉBEC spearheaded multiple collaborative efforts with several Northern and island communities, such as Nunavik and the Magdalen Islands.

These efforts include:

- / Conducting a study on curbside collection on the Magdalen Islands, jointly with Éco Entreprises Québec (ÉEQ);
- / Sitting on several committees that bring together various partners as well as the Kativik Regional Government;
- / Holding meetings and discussions with the First Nations of Quebec and Labrador Sustainable Development Institute (FNQLSDI).

## Program for excellence in residual materials management

Launched in September 2018, the program for excellence in residual materials management (GMR Pro) is intended for Ouebec municipalities that want to commit to a drive for excellence in residual materials management. The program is intended to be a tool to optimize practices, ensure continuous improvement and perform to the objective of zero waste and sustainable waste management.



Rolled out by Réseau Environnement **1R Pro** and RECYC-QUÉBEC, GMR Pro was developed in partnership with more than 15 municipal organizations.

## Municipal waste management plans

With an Act to amend the Environment Quality Act (EOA) coming into force, RECYC- QUÉBEC's mandate was expanded and is now tasked with analyzing municipal waste management plan compliance.

Furthermore, to assist and support municipal organizations in reviewing their municipal waste management plan, RECYC-QUÉBEC has begun to develop a companion guide that lays out the expectations for plan compliance in addition to providing practical information for carrying out this exercise. A presentation on the guide was given during the last Colloque sur la gestion des matières résiduelles conference and a consultation on the auide was also held in early 2019.

## ORGANIC WASTE

## New responsibility: Residential and community composting program

Since March 2019, RECYC-QUÉBEC has been responsible for managing the residential and community composting program and supporting municipalities in preparing and carrying out their projects for diverting organic waste from disposal.





## Love Food Hate Waste campaign



RECYC-QUÉBEC partnered with the National Zero Waste Council to develop the J'aime manger, pas gaspiller, compaign, a French adaptation of the Love Food Hate Waste campaign, which has a proven track record in terms of behavioural changes. Rolled out across Canada in French and in English, this campaign offers a wealth of information and practical advice for reducing food waste.

Awareness-raising tools have been produced, including a turnkey toolkit for municipalities.

## Campaign to encourage composting

On the theme of "Le compostage, on s'y engage!", the goal of this campaign was to promote citizen participation in organic waste recovery.

Video clips were developed and distributed on social media in addition to practical tips and recommended habits to encourage residents to adopt the brown bin as part of their routine.

## CRD SECTOR

## Working with the industry

RECYC-QUÉBEC has continued its work with the construction, renovation and demolition (CRD) industry, particularly with the Regroupement des récupérateurs et des recycleurs de matériaux de construction et de démolition du Québec (3R MCDQ) and the Conseil des entreprises en technologies environnementales du Québec (CETEQ), to implement various measures to improve prospects for the CRD waste sector.

## Study on gypsum waste in Quebec

To better understand the flow of avpsum in Ouebec and to get a clearer picture of its use, from marketing in the form of drywall to its end of life, RECYC-QUÉBEC conducted a study on this matter.

The study on gypsum waste in Quebec [in French only] also serves as a foundation for better understanding the challenges and identifying opportunities for better handling of the material by site managers and CRD waste sorting centres.



## Training on sustainable management of sites

In partnership with Université Laval's Centre de formation en développement durable, RECYC-QUÉBEC held a training day on sustainable management of work sites in Montréal and Ouébec City.

The purpose of this training was to share best practices for reducing environmental impacts of the construction sector, from design to end of life, including building planning, construction and maintenance.

## CRD waste sorting centre recognition program

RECYC-QUÉBEC also innovated by developing a program that recognizes CRD waste sorting centres that advance best practices.

Meetings were held with several associations in the field and the Minister of the Environment and the Fight against Climate Change (MELCC) in order to finalize the various parameters of the program being developed.

# ICI SECTOR

## ICI on recycle + program

RECYC-QUÉBEC launched the enhanced and improved version of its recognition program ICI on recycle +. New developments include two interactive maps:



- / An <u>interactive map</u> that presents all the certified facilities in the program.
- / An interactive map specifically for the public showing certified industries, commerces and institutions (ICI) that offer a product or service accessible to the general public.

#### Number of certified participants

In 2018–2019, the program had 961 participating ICI locations. Since the new version of the program was launched, 471 ICI locations have registered. This is a record average of 2.16 new requests per day!

#### Newsletter and social media

The ICI on recycle+ newsletter, published several times per year, has more than 7,000 subscribers.

Furthermore, to highlight our certified participants and their innovative practices, we have published 45 posts on our social media, which have reached an average of 2,600 people per post.

#### Presentations and training

Our experts have given 14 presentations on the ICI on recycle + program as well as training on waste management in industries, commerces and institutions (ICI).

## REDUCTION AT SOURCE

## Presentations by our experts

RECYC-QUÉBEC experts offered presentations on reduction at source to more than 350 industry professionals at the Réseau Environnement's Colloque sur la gestion des matières résiduelles as well as to stakeholders involved in organizing eco-friendly events during the training day as part of the Vivats awards.

RECYC-QUÉBEC, as a presenting partner of the Vivats awards contest, presented two awards, for prevention and reduction at source and for responsible waste management.





## La Tasse

One of RECYC-OUÉBEC's critical roles is to encourage innovative projects that promote reduction at source, such as La Tasse.

Launched in August 2018, La Tasse is the very first Quebec system for refundable coffee cups. This initiative, already implemented in several businesses, offers a reusable cup as a sustainable alternative to disposable cups used for hot takeaway beverages.

## Assises québécoises de l'économie circulaire

RECYC-QUÉBEC is proud to have held the very first Assises québécoises de l'économie circulaire conference, in partnership with the Ministry of Economy and Innovation (MEI) and the Institut de l'environnement, du développement durable et de l'économie circulaire (Institut EDDEC).

A true flagship event for Quebec's circular economy, the conference was a unique opportunity to take stock of the situation, share innovative initiatives and identify opportunities to be seized collectively.

The event attracted more than 400 participants from multi-sector organizations, companies, ministries and organizations.

## Sharing expertise

Fundamental to our mission as a government corporation, the circular economy represents a future avenue for Quebec and as a first-line actor in this transition, RECYC-OUÉBEC has shared its expertise as part of several events and presentations.

## **PROGRAMS**

## **TIRES**

Further to the performance audit on the management of the Quebec Integrated Used Tire Management Program conducted by the Auditor General of Quebec (VGQ), RECYC-QUÉBEC took note of the observations in the report and acted in accordance with its recommendations.

To that end, RECYC-QUÉBEC developed and implemented a concrete action plan in which the Corporation committed to focus on developing innovative projects and support Quebec companies that manufacture high value-added by-products.

Considering that the Quebec Integrated Used Tire Management Program aims to position Quebec among the leaders in transforming scrap tires, RECYC-QUÉBEC's main objective is to make every effort to send the majority of recovered tires to the remoulding and recycling industry to promote the circularity of the material and minimize the volume sent to waste-for-energy.

Several measures have therefore been taken.





## / Financial support

To support the industry, RECYC-QUÉBEC launched a call for proposals to promote the development of markets to reuse and recycle scrap tires [in French only]. Financial assistance for this call for proposals was \$1.8 million. The projects selected primarily concerned adding processing equipment or optimizing existing equipment procedures to allow for the recycling of 20,000 additional tonnes of scrap tires.

On March 31, 2019, three companies received financial assistance, including a new player, Weded, which produces ground rubber and fibre pellets?

Concurrently, a partnership with Université Laval is ongoing to develop markets for products made from recycled scrap tires and plastics.

#### / Web portal

RECYC-QUÉBEC created a **portal** for managing scrap tires to simplify the administrative steps surrounding their collection at the 11,000 retailers. This new, simple and practical portal makes it possible to request a tire collection easily at any time, in addition to centralizing communication with transporters.

New functionalities also allow RECYC-QUÉBEC to be even more efficient in managing material flows, such as compiling the number of tires to collect at collection points in real time.



#### / Breakdown of tires collected and processed by tire category




#### **EXPLANATION:**

The difference between the 91,851 tonnes processed and the 98,358 tonnes transported is due to RECYC-QUÉBEC needing to transport a portion of the tires delivered to two of its processing centres (Dynamat and Techno Pneu) to another processing centre after sorting because they are not able to process all types of automobile tires.



#### REFUNDABLE CONTAINERS

#### / Partnership with the microbrewing industry

RECYC-QUÉBEC partnered with the Association des microbrasseries du Québec (AMBQ) to establish a process for collecting and washing refillable containers as well as sharing the costs of the system.

Two private agreements governing the use of two bottle formats now exist. with a total of 50 signatories.

#### / Other achievement:

Renewal of the <u>eagreement on refunding</u>, <u>recovery and recycling of non-refillable</u> beer containers [in French only] and the addition of a monetary incentive to achieve 75% in recovered alass.

#### / Consignéco

Consignéco continued its Journées de la consigne this year, which raised public awareness of the economic, ecological and social value of refundable containers while highlighting the initiatives of local organizations.

Close to 100,000 refundable containers were collected during the 2018–2019 events. The money raised was donated to a dozen causes and local organizations.



## EXTENDED PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY (EPR)

The some 8,500 drop-off points as well as the many one-time collections held in municipalities across the province made it possible to collect more than 101,000 tonnes of materials in 2017, all of which are products covered by EPR as a whole.

These results are very positive because they reflect an increase of almost 5% over amounts collected in 2015 by all individual and collective programs. It should be noted that between 2015 and 2017, the population grew by 1.6%.

In 2017, more than 101,000 tonnes of materials were collected.

#### / Year 2018

With more than 9,000 drop-off points and numerous one-time collections in municipalities across the province, the individual and collective programs together made it possible to recover more than 97,000 tonnes of materials in 2018, all products covered by EPR as a whole. There is a slight drop of approximately 4% compared to 2017, which could be explained in part because of the miniaturization of electronic products or by the materials used, as well as by the performance of engines and oils that reduce the frequency of changes. These results show that the scope of recovery efforts is being maintained and that citizens, like industries, businesses and institutions, continue to direct products to the appropriate channels.

## BEHAVIOURAL CHANGES

## Introduction of spokesperson Ti-Mé

RECYC-QUÉBEC announced its partnership with Ti-Mé, the popular character played by Claude Meunier in the show *La Petite Vie*, as the organization's first spokesperson.

A natural recycler, Ti-Mé uses humour to underline the mission of helping Quebecers to implement the 4Rs (reduce, reuse, recycle and recover) through various campaigns and communication tools.
